

PATTERN BY PHIL FERGURON

THIS IS A LITTLE TRIFFICULT. PRIOR CROCHET experience is recommended!

### TOOLS YOU'LL need:

- Scissors
- Yarn needle
- 10mm crochet hook
- 3.5mm crochet hook

#### materials you'll need:

- Plastic costume glasses to fit (we used party glasses)

#### 8PLY 100G YARN YOU'LL NEED:

- 4 x balls of pink yarn (C1)
- 2 x balls of green yarn (C2) 1 x ball of blue yarn (C3)
- 1 x ball of purple varn (C4)





## **PROJECT LENGTHS:**

Grownups = we've made a 105cm outfit



This pattern is easy to adjust for any specific size.

- 1. Calculate the length of the costume you'd like
- 2. Add or subtract the number of C1 rows from the Main Blanket pattern (1 row equates to 1cm of length)

## **ABBREVIATIONS KEY:**

sts = stitches

mc = magic circle

ch = chain

dc = double crochet

inc = double crochet two stitches in the same stitch,

increasing the amount of stitches.

dec = double crochet two stitches together

(or decreasing using which ever method your prefer)

Whole project is done through both loops unless otherwise specified.

The total amount of stitches you should have will be in parentheses at the end of each row. Meaning that when you see (20) at the end of a row, it means there will be 20 stitches in that row.

Any repeated actions within a row will also be in parentheses, alongside the amount of times that action will be taken in that row. Example. (2dc, inc) x 10 means two double crochets then increase on the third, repeat this ten times.

(Note: We use the term double crochet in this pattern, but you might call it a single crochet where you live)

In this pattern we will also note when to change colours, and will note when to change colours using their designation (example: 20sts in C1, 5 sts in C2, 20sts in C1).

NOW YOU HAVE EVERYTHING YOU NEED...LET'S GO!

# **GROWNUP SIZE (MAIN BLANKET):**

All yarn used in this project is DOUBLED, although if you would like to find an equivalent CHUNKY yarn, you can use that as well.

Starting the project in C1, with 10mm hook:

Row 1: MC10 (10)

Row 2: inc10 (20)

Row 3: (dc, inc) x 10 (30)

Row 4: 30dc (30)

Row 5: (2dc, inc) x 10 (40) Row 6: 40dc (40)

Row 7: (3dc, inc) x 10 (50) Row 8 - 16: 50dc (50)









Now continue to go back and forth along the row, starting each row into the 2nd sts

Row 17 - 28: 1ch, into 2nd sts 35dc (35)

Row 29: 1ch, into 2nd sts 35dc, 11ch (46) Row 30: into 2nd sts, 45 dc, 16ch (61)

Row 30: into 2nd sts, 45 dc, 16ch (61) Row 31: into 2nd sts, 50 inc, 10dc (110)

Row 32-80: ch, into 2nd sts, 110dc (110)

Change colour to C2, cutting and sewing in any loose threads.

Row 81-99: ch, into 2nd sts, 110dc (110)

Now it's time to go around the edge to tidy up and add the detail. Start at the left side of the face in C1, (this is my left, your right if you are wearing it).



Row 100:

Crocheting between rows: 11dc.

Now along the top of the left side: 10dc, 2ch.

Now along the left side: 49dc.

Continuing on the left side, now changing to C2, cutting and sewing in any loose ends: 19dc, 2ch.

Now working along the bottom: 110dc, 2ch.

Now working along the right side: 19dc.

Now changing colours to C1, cutting and sewing any loose ends: 49dc, 2ch.

Now along the top of the right side: 15dc. Now along the right side of the face: 11dc.

Now along the right side of the face: Now along the top of the face: 15dc.

Slip stitch, cut yarn and sew back into work.

## TO add additional detail

You can crochet a curve back into the top of the costume by working back into the head but this isn't required.





# KIDDO SIZE (MAIN BLANKET):

All yarn used in this project is DOUBLED, although if you would like to find an equivalent CHUNKY yarn, you can use that as well.

Starting the project in C1, with 10mm hook:

Row 1: MC10 (10)

Row 2: inc10 (20) Row 3: (dc. inc) x 10 (30)

Row 4: 30dc (30)

Row 5: (2dc, inc) x 10 (40)

Row 6 - 10: 40dc (40)









Now continue to go back and forth along the row, starting each row into the 2nd sts

Row 11-20: 1ch, into 2nd sts 25dc (25)

Row 21: 1ch, into 2nd sts 25dc, 11ch (41) Row 22: into 2nd sts, 35dc, 16ch (51)

Row 22: into 2nd sts, 35dc, 16ch (51) Row 23: into 2nd sts, 40 inc, 10dc (90) Row 24-40: ch. into 2nd sts. 110dc (90)

Change colour to C2, cutting and sewing in

Change colour to C2, cutting and sewing in any loose threads.



Row 41-50: ch. into 2nd sts. 90dc (90)

Now it's time to go around the edge to tidy up and add the detail. Start at the left side of the face in C1, (this is my left, your right if you are wearing it).



Row 51:

Crocheting between rows: 10dc.

Now along the top of the left side: 10dc, 2ch.

Now along the left side: 16dc.

Continuing on the left side, now changing to C2, cutting and sewing in any loose ends: 10dc, 2ch.

Now working along the bottom: 90dc, 2ch.

Now working along the right side: 10dc.

Now changing colours to C1, cutting and sewing any loose ends: 16dc, 2ch.

Now along the top of the right side: 15dc.

Now along the right side of the face: 10dc.

Now along the top of the face: 15dc.

Slip stitch, cut yarn and sew back into work.

## TO add additional detail

You can crochet a curve back into the top of the costume by working back into the head but this isn't required.





#### The rest of the pattern will work for grownup and kiddo sizes!

The glasses used are plastic party glasses, you can also make your own using craft wire if not possible to find.

Alternatively you could do this on two (2) rings and attach them both at the centre and then sew together to the top of the blanket.



#### Project to be completed in C4 and with a 3.5mm hook.

Glasses facing forward, starting either side on the rims on the left side of the temple, you have to crochet around.

To do this, have the varn slip-knotted onto your hook and catch the varn around the rim, coming through the centre, now catch the yarn again from above the rim, pull the yarn though and then 1ch. Continue around the ring, pulling the yarn around the rim of the glasses but now double crocheting.

Proceed to do half of the glasses so they end up with 20 sts before the bridge, then from the other side of the bridge, do another 20dc.

You should now end up with 40 sts in total around the rim of the glasses. Do not cut the varn. (40)

### GLASSES FEATHERS: CENTRE



Row 1: Going into the beginning of the ring, 2dc, 1ch, (3)

You will now be going back and forth along the row, starting from the second sts.

Row 2-3: 4dc, 1ch. (5) Row 4: dec, 2dc, 1ch (4) Row 5: dec, 1dc. (2)

#### I FFT AND RIGHT

With the center feather completed, you can start the left and right feathers.

You will start these five stitches from the first stitch of the center either side (both begin five stitches away).

To know if you are doing it right, each resulting feather should have a one stitch space between.

Row 1: Slipstitch and then 1ch, 3dc along the row, 1ch (5) Row 2-3: 4dc, 1ch. (5) Row 4: dec, 2dc, 1ch (4) Row 5: dec, 1dc. (2) Slip stitch, cut yarn and then sew back into project.

## EYEBROWS:

Starting project in C3 and with a 3.5mm hook.

Row 1: 11ch (11)

Row 2: Into 2nd sts, 10dc, ch, 10dc, ch (22)

Row 3: 22dc (22)

Slip stitch leaving long tail, sew the two eyebrows onto the main body along Row 8, leaving approx 4 stitches space between the two eyebrows. Sew any excess yarn back into the eyebrows.
